1. CALL TO ORDER

Santa Fe Springs Resident Johana Ambriz addressed the Commission regarding traffic issues on Flallon Avenue. Her major concern is the excessive speeding on the street during school hours in the morning, afternoon and during rush hour. She would like to see if the City can implement a stop sign, 25 mph speed limit signage or rumble strips along the street.


