

The Planning Department is pleased to announce the winners of the 6th Annual National Community Planning Month Photo Contest!






#### New Assistant City Manager, Nicholas Razo

The Family and Youth Intervention Team understands that Parent involvement is key to behavior change among behaviorally challenged adolescents.


The Parent Project is a parent training program designed for parents experiencing behavioral challenges with their adolescent(s). Throughout the program, parents will be introduced to discussion topics which include reducing family conflict and arguing, improving school performance and attendance, identifying and intervening with alcohol and other drug abuse, interceding with negative peer associations (including inappropriate dating relationships

up to and including gang involvement) and helping parents to set effective applicable limits.

Many parents attending the Parent Project have experienced difficulty in identifying appropriate limits and enforcing consequences consistently. Those who attend the Parent Project are more likely to see their child's attendance at school improve, and to require less school based disciplinary resources as parents find powerful interventions at home which help bring about positive change in their children.

The motto of the Parent Project is "Parents are the answer... when they have the tools they need." This program is presented three times per year. #### Home Security Camera Rebate Program
